Impact of Pupil Premium Results on progress from 2015-2016 academic year

Number of children: 20 out of 99 (20%)

Percentage eligible for FSM: 4% (National 25%)

Percentage of Forces children: 16% KS1 – 12% KS2 – 4%

Progress

The majority of pupils eligible for PP in KS1 come to school with little or no pre-school experience and stay for one year or move mid-year. 50% of the pupils will not be on roll in 2016/17.

70% were end of year ready in English and Maths.

Summary of intended Pupil Premium spending 2016-17

Our school objectives in spending Pupil Premium for 2016-17:

- To ensure all pupils in low income families make as much progress and achieve as well as other pupils.
- To establish a rigorous baseline assessment system to ensure pupils in receipt of PP are assessed on entry to identify gaps in learning.
- To ensure the 'looked after' pupils and pupils living in forces families make as much progress and achieve as well as other pupils.
